Also, for the November neighborhood meeting on November 14th, our special guest will be Councilman Chuck Grayeb. Councilman Grayeb was elected last April to represent our neighborhood (2nd district). Please come and listen, ask questions, and add any suggestions.

Our annual Uplands Picnic held on September 14th was a GREAT SUCCESS! As always, excellent food, great weather and of course, excellent neighbors! Thanks to all who helped and attended. A special thank you to Desire Kane, our picnic chairperson, who spent many hours planning our picnic. Also, after the picnic was over; we had some leftover meat, rolls, chips, etc. The URA decided to donate this food to the South Side Mission. The Mission graciously accepted the food.

On September 20th, the Uplands finally had their new neighborhood signs installed. Wow! They sure do make a big difference. The signs truly give our neighborhood a unique eloquence. In case you were wondering how we received these signs, it all started back in 2009 when Jehan Gordon (repjehangordon@gmail.com), our State Representative for the Peoria area (92nd District), first took office. I



spoke to Representative Gordon awhile back, and she informed me that one of the first things she did after taking office was to request a Capital Bill (later called Capital Improvement Grant). Monies from this bill would be redirected and will be invested back into neighborhoods across her district. Rep. Gordon told me "deep in her heart that these funds were really a great need for our neighborhoods, especially for our older areas." Money funded through this grant could include infrastructure improvement, such as sidewalks, curbs, decorative street signs, neighborhood signs, repairs of a historic foundation, etc. One stipulation was that any of the new improvement(s) to a neighborhood had to last at least 25 years or more. The approved grant money from Springfield was directed through the Peoria Neighborhood Alliance. From there, grant money was finally directed to the Uplands. This process was several years in the making and countless hours of paperwork

(which is very common when receiving grant money). This is a brief synopsis on how we received our beautiful signs. I personally believe that our signs are an example of government money well spent. Open Discussion of Traffic Redesign at October URA Meeting

Please come to the October URA meeting to provide your viewpoints about our neighborhood's needs for the redesigned intersection at University and Main.

URA VP Dan Armich's Public Traffic Meeting Notes

- Based on the current long range plans, e.g. Heart of Peoria Plan, there are three major options available that the City has looked at.
 - a) raised table intersection with no change to existing lanes.
 - b) single lane round about.
 - c) reduction to three lanes for all streets and increased sidewalk area.
- The City has stated that although these are the three ideas they have currently, the City traffic engineers are open to other ideas as well.
- There are both supporters and critics of the round about concept
- The main issues brought up by residents of the surrounding neighborhoods and people who

work in this area are that the intersection be more pedestrian friendly than it is today and that the intersection be safer.

- Other topics that were stated by members of the audience members were an all red light time, underpasses for pedestrians, over-street walkways for pedestrians, walkable sidewalks, and the left hand turn into Avanti's.
